



Where can I get free downloadable ebooks?

The following is a short list of good sources for free & bargain ebook content compiled by the Portland Public Library staff. Sites are marked with “**ePub**” if they will play on Nook, Kobo and other non-Amazon ereaders and “**Kindle**” if they will play on the Amazon Kindle. Ebooks available from these sites will also play on most computers and are available in other formats like pdf and html. Most titles will also play on iPhone, Blackberry, or Android smart phones with ereader apps. Maine InfoNet Download Library <http://download.maineinfonet.org/>

Nearly 2,500 ebooks - Fiction, Non-Fiction, YA and Children’s content - are available as downloadable eBooks. This is in addition to an ever-growing collection of downloadable audiobooks. Both the eBooks and audio books can be checked out and downloaded by library cardholders of participating libraries across Maine, which includes Portland Public Library. Limit: 3 titles per user at one time. **ePub, Kindle**

On the Maine InfoNet Download Library site look for the icon for "[Additional eBooks, Always Available](#)" free content (bottom left of Maine InfoNet Download Library home page), most of it from Project Gutenberg (see below). These titles will not count against your checkout limits.



Public Domain Books

Books in the public domain are those titles for which copyright has expired or been forfeited. These are generally widely available. Many of the ebook services listed below offer free access to public domain titles, some in addition to fee-based titles. This is a short list of some of the best known services.

Project Gutenberg - www.gutenberg.org/wiki/Main_Page

Over 36,000 free public domain ebooks available to download to PC, Kindle, iPad, iPhone, Android, or other portable device. **ePub, Kindle**

ManyBooks - www.manybooks.net

Over 29,000 free public domain titles; 35 languages represented. **ePub, Kindle**
Mobile version: mnybks.net. **ePub, Kindle**

Open Library - www.openlibrary.org

A project of the non-profit Internet Archive. Claims over 1 million titles. Search for eBook specifically by checking the box that says "show only eBooks" under the main search box. **ePub, Kindle**

Original Works

Smashwords - www.smashwords.com/

Many free ebooks from independent authors and publishers. **ePub, Kindle**

FeedBooks - www.feedbooks.com/publicdomain

Includes free original books in addition to thousands of previously published public domain books. Not all books are free, but many are and fees are low for those that are for sale. **ePub, Kindle**

Scribd - www.scribd.com

Scribd calls itself the world's largest social reading and publishing company, making it easy to share and discover entertaining, informative and original written content across the web and mobile devices. **All html**

National Academies Press www.nap.edu/catalog

The NAP publishes more than 200 books a year on a wide range of topics in science, engineering, and health, capturing the most authoritative views on important issues in science and health policy. More than 4,000 NAP books in PDF format are available to download for free. You must look at each book to see if it is available as a free **PDF**.

Baen Books www.baen.com/library This publisher of fiction and fantasy offers some titles as free downloads. Sample authors Eric Flint, Lois McMaster Bujold, Mercedes Lackey and David Weber. You can save to your computer or send them directly to your Kindle. **ePub, Kindle**

Online Book Stores and Device/Format-Specific Services

Web-based bookstores offer a variety of options for acquiring ebooks, from bestsellers to purchase to free ebooks made available as marketing promotions, public domain offerings, or samples from independent authors and publishers. *Note some stores advertise samples or first chapters as free "books"*. You may have to sign up for accounts with these services in order to access. Among the best sources for free content are:

Amazon Kindle Store - www.amazon.com/kindle

Amazon offers free titles for promotions each week. To see what's available, go to the Kindle Store on the Amazon.com web site, select the 'Discussions' tab at the top of the page, and look for "Free Books" in the Forums discussions list. A regular poster named Happy Reader "Joyce" posts a daily list of free Kindle books. **Kindle**

www.ereaderiq.com/free/ is an Amazon Affiliate Program member that offers a list (updated hourly!) of free titles for the Kindle. There were 825 titles recently listed on one day! Users can sign up to receive an email notification of new titles as they are added (see box at top right of web page). You can actually view this list on your kindle at m.eReaderIQ.com

Limited time offers and other selections from Smashwords.com (see above). Good user interface BUT you have to download the Sony Reader software to get the books. Kind of a pain if you already have Adobe Digital Editions. Better just to download from Smashwords directly into Adobe Digital Editions, if you're already using that program to read/transfer books from Overdrive. **ePub; Kindle versions also available through**

Index Sites and Other Helpful Finding Aids and Tools

Inkmesh - inkmesh.com Calls itself a "Ebook search engine to find free ebooks and compare ebook prices for the Kindle, iPhone, Nook, Sony Reader and more!" A slick tool which indexes 34 major web sites for ebook title availability, both free and for sale, with info on Amazon ratings, device compatibility, price, etc. **ePub, Kindle**

AddAll - ebooks.addall.com/ Indexes 30 sites. Includes free and for sale books, from Amazon, Barnes and Noble Sony and eHarlequin. Especially useful for price comparison. Search results display in clearly readable grid format featuring sortable price and format fields. **ePub, Kindle**

Pixeloflnk – www.pixelofink.com Links to free and bargain Kindle and Nook books. You can sign up for a daily RSS feed or browse the Facebook page.

Pixeloflnk for Young Readers <http://ye.pixelofink.com> Site featuring free and bargain books for children and young adults. Also on Facebook.

Online Books Page <http://digital.library.upenn.edu/books> from the University of Pennsylvania. An index to hundreds of thousands of free ebooks available on the Internet. Indexes for a celebration of women writers, banned books online, prize winners, serials.

Christianbook.com <http://www.christianbook.com/ebooks/>

Features links to some free and bargain Christian ebooks, app available.

These sites also index books, audiobooks and magazines; Inkmesh also covers Audible.com.

Blogs & Forums

Books on the Knob - blog.booksontheknob.org/ Bargain reads, free ebooks and book reviews for the Kindle, Nook, kobo, Sony and other ereaders. You can sign up for a daily RSS feed. **ePub, Kindle**

Dailycheapreads.com - dailycheapreads.com Free and cheap. You can sign up for a daily RSS feed. **Kindle.**

TextVook - <http://www.vook.com/blog/> Blog about a new format of ebook that includes video and animation. Reportedly has occasional notices about free books, textbooks and textvooks, bargains during the year.

MobileRead Forum - www.mobileread.com **ePub, Kindle**

Lending Book Sites

Most of these services connect those who own lendable ebooks. Readers post their own ebook titles and locate ebooks through the service. Readers then must use Amazon *Loan this book* option or the Nook *LendMe* option to actually lend or borrow. Although some ebooks that you purchase from Nook and Kindle allow swapping, the number of swaps are typically limited. There are strict rules governing the books and the number of times that they can be borrowed. Keep an eye out for future lendable Apple ibooks and Google ebooks.

eBookFling <http://ebookfling.com> Offers users an option to swap e-books with other readers nationwide while still retaining ownership. For every five books listed to loan out users get one credit towards borrowing. **ePub, Kindle.**

LendInk <http://www.lendink.com> Users search and borrow Kindle or Nook titles through Amazon or Barnes and Noble. Lendability of books based on strict publisher guidelines and requires sharing email addresses.

eBook Exchange <http://www.ebookexchange.com> similar to the above services.

Amazon Kindle Lending Library offers an option to borrow up to one book per month from the Lending Library. This is a fee service provided when you pay an annual fee for an Amazon Prime account.
