A special Library of Congress traveling exhibition—mounted in a customized 18-wheel truck—will visit Portland on Friday, September 2nd and 3rd in Monument Square. The visit is co-hosted by the Portland Public Library and Portland's Downtown District.

The "Gateway to Knowledge" exhibition will bring high-quality facsimiles of many of the Library's top treasures and information about the millions of resources in the Library's unparalleled collections. The exhibit will include programming especially for teachers and students and provide relevant and engaging learning experiences for lifelong learners.

Portland will be one of 90 sites visited through September, 2011.
